

LET IT SLOW: ADVENT, CHRISTMAS, EPIPHANY AND BEYOND

This year, I am going to travel through Advent with the Archbishop of York, Stephen Cottrell. Well, at least his book, *Let It Slow: An Advent Calendar with a difference*.

As we know, all too well, this period, leading up to Christmas, is often very very busy. Frantic. He points out, that even though we are seemingly more in touch than ever, we seem to have lost touch with ourselves. Christmas is one of the most joyful times of year but can also be one of the most stressful times. Perhaps especially so this year.

Let It Slow, gives a slightly different way to approach Christmas, to discover or rediscover how its joys and promises can restore our lives. For each day, during December, he invites us with simple reflections and practical suggestions, to reclaim Christmas and the celebration it is meant to be.

He contrasts what he calls the, 'Christmas myth', the idealised images, that we see in TV advertising, with the Christmas of the Bible, with a pregnant, unmarried, young mum, almost abandoned, then supported by her fiancé. Heavily pregnant, she travels large distances to obey tax laws of an occupying foreign power. When they get there, there is nowhere to give birth, only an animal shelter, no painkillers, doctor, midwife or clean sheets. He observes that the Christmas in the Bible is (perhaps uncomfortably), closer to real life but because of that it can speak to all of us struggling with challenges, of one sort or another.

December 3rd begins with, "so tell me what you want, what you really, really want..." I always find it difficult when people ask me what I want for Christmas. It feels like I have too much stuff and probably don't need more of it. *Let It Slow*, invites us to find some time to stop and be still, if only for a few minutes. To think about what truly brings us joy and comfort, and to see how that could become part of our Christmas celebration.

So, what would you really like this year for Christmas? And what do you want for the world? Revd Diane

New fast train service

There will be a big improvement to our train services from December 12th. Once an hour on weekdays, there will be a fast train from Otford and Swanley to London Bridge and Charing Cross, taking only 20 minutes from Swanley to London Bridge. The trains will leave Otford at 37 minutes past each hour and Swanley at 46 minutes past, plus one extra morning rush hour train. There are good connections from and to Shoreham, with the connection from Shoreham to Swanley at 32 minutes past. Coming back, the trains leave Charing Cross are at half past the hour, running as late as 11:30pm, for that big night out in the West End! You can also get to London Bridge via Sevenoaks, which is also pretty quick, but the connection isn't quite so convenient.

Defibrillator at Shoreham Station

There is now a defibrillator on the Sevenoaks-bound platform at the station. It's attached to the station building, somewhat hidden behind a cabinet.

Twitton Field

NEWS FROM SHOREHAM VILLAGE SCHOOL, NOVEMBER 2022

It really does feel like we are 'back in business' after a few years of lockdowns and Covid-related absences. We have been able to participate in lots of lovely and enriching events such as the recent Sevenoaks Choral afternoon at the Stag Theatre, when Cameron Class sang in front of, and with, ten other local schools as a mass choir, and the Aqua Splash Festival for some of our Year 3 and 4 pupils who swam with style and determination.

In late October, all of our teaching and support staff attended the Sevenoaks Partnership of Primary Schools conference with keynote speaker Sharon Grey (OBE), who led learning on the Biology of Stress (what is happening to our brains during times of stress?), the impact of stress on IQ and the ability to learn. In the afternoon we attended workshops on Autistic Spectrum Condition. This was a truly interesting and inspiring day that will impact positively on our future practice.

I have been immensely proud of many specific pupils recently who have demonstrated leadership skills in a number of ways over the past few weeks. Our House Captains prepared and delivered a presentation on our school value 'Respect', during the school Remembrance assembly, showing their understanding of the concept and linking it to the reasons we remember anyone who has given service to our country.

SHOREHAM PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council had to change the dates of some of the meetings in order to observe the official mourning period following the death of HM Queen Elizabeth. The Council held a minute's silence at the October Meeting and the Chairman, on behalf of the Council and residents of Shoreham, sent a letter of condolence to HM King Charles III. Members welcomed Cllr Jane Austin, who was co-opted on to Shoreham Parish Council, to represent the Well Hill ward.

Members have discussed and agreed various items at the Parish Council Meetings in October and November

2022 and here are a few highlights.

- A225 Shoreham Road speed limit the proposal will most likely go to the Joint Transport Board on 13 December 2022 following the consultation which received 82 comments in support and 31 objections.
- Darent Valley Landscape Partnership Scheme Path there appears to be some hold ups with the path and the Council are in contact with the DVLP.
- 4 new defibrillators have been ordered so there will be a total of 8 covering the whole Parish as follows:

MEMORIES OF JILL AND TOM MORGAN

Tom and Jill Morgan moved to the Shoreham area in 1949 with four children under twelve when they bought "Record" in Church Street in 1952 just before the birth of their 5th child. Soon after this Tom was posted to Korea (the Korean War ended in June 1953) leaving Jill on her own with five children in the big, cold, rambling house. Still two years before the end of rationing, Christmas celebrations were few and Jill decided that the children shouldn't miss out on the season's cheer. The plan was simple, squash and reindeer-shaped biscuits for everyone, mulled wine for the adults. When the guests were assembled in the large room that used to be a village shop, FC emerged from the cellar

through a trapdoor into the middle of the party with his sack of presents and ringing a bell. The party was timed to allow the visitors to attend the children's carol service at the church after the presents had been distributed, leaving FC to the reindeer and a warming drink.

The idea caught on, Jill and Tom continued the tradition on and off over the next fifty years until 2002 when they left Record for a bungalow in the High Street.
