Forgiveness

"It was in a church in Munich that I saw him. One moment I saw the overcoat and the brown hat; the next, a blue uniform and a visored cap with its skull and crossbones. It came back with a rush: the huge room with its harsh overhead lights, the pathetic pile of dresses and shoes in the centre of the floor, the shame of walking naked past this man. I could see my sister's frail form ahead of me, ribs sharp beneath the parchment skin. Betsie and I had been arrested for concealing Jews; this man had been a guard at Ravensbrück concentration camp where we were sent.

Now he was in front of me, hand thrust out: "How good it is to know that, as you say, all our sins are at the bottom of the sea!" And I, who had spoken so glibly of forgiveness, fumbled in my pocketbook rather than take that hand. He would not remember me, of course–how could he remember one prisoner among those thousands of women? It was the first time since my release that I had been face to face with one of my captors and my blood seemed to freeze.

"You mentioned Ravensbrück in your talk," he was saying. "I was a guard there." "But since that time I have become a Christian. I know that God has forgiven me, but I would like to hear it from your lips as well –again the hand came out"–will you forgive me?"

And I stood there–I whose sins had every day to be forgiven–and could not. Betsie had died in that place–could he erase her slow terrible death simply for the asking? It could not have been many seconds that he stood there, hand held out, but to me it seemed hours as I wrestled with the most difficult thing I had ever had to do.

And still I stood there with the coldness clutching my heart. But forgiveness is an act of the will, and the will can function regardless of the temperature of the heart.

"Jesus, help me!" I prayed silently. "I can lift my hand. I can do that much. You supply the feeling." And so woodenly, mechanically, I thrust my hand into the one stretched out to me." (*Corrie Ten-Boom, The Hiding Place, 1976*)

I read this book in my mid teens and this powerful story of forgiveness has stayed with me. As she shakes his hand, she describes a 'healing warmth' spreading down her arm, so she is able to say, "I forgive you" to her former captor. The topic of forgiveness seems to be much in the news these days. Not just from the church but when thinking about relationships in a variety of contexts. Of course, every time we say the Lord's Prayer, we say: 'Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us'. Perhaps we say those words too easily, perhaps we underestimate how much courage and faith it takes to forgive, perhaps we are too impatient, failing to accept that sometimes

forgiveness is a process that takes time, or perhaps, the hardest person to forgive is ourself ... but we do need to do it.

Numerous studies show that *practising* forgiveness has powerful health benefits, including lower levels of depression and anxiety, higher self esteem and greater life satisfaction. And as Corrie Ten-Boom observes: "For I had to do it–I knew that. I knew it not only as a commandment of God, but as a daily experience. Those who were able to forgive their former enemies were able also to return to the outside world and rebuild their lives, no matter what the physical scars. Those who nursed their bitterness remained invalids. It was as simple and as horrible as that." **Rev Diane**

Nick White gave a talk on The Four Battles of Sevenoaks - conflicts of national importance that took place on our doorstep. The first was the 8th century invasion of Kent by the Mercian king, Offa, which led to a battle where the Darent passes to the west of Otford. A short distance away at Twitton, King Canute's men faced a bloody conflict in 1016 against Edmund Ironside. And Nick also covered revolts by Jack Cade (1450) and Sir Thomas Wyatt (1554) that led to skirmishes at Solefields and east of Otford.

The next meeting of the Historical Society will be on 20 October when David Cufley will talk about The Coming of the Railway and the Changing Landscape, doors open 7.30pm for socialising and speaker at 8pm. JOB VACANCY - CLERK TO THE TRUSTEES OF SHOREHAM ALMSHOUSES TRUST

The Almshouses in Filston Lane are among the oldest buildings in Shoreham and are an important part of the village's history. They are Grade 2 listed and date back to the 16th century. Two dwellings exist to provide homes for resident beneficiaries, who are single people who have a connection with the parish.

We have a great group of friendly and dedicated volunteer Trustees, who bring a range of skills and experience to manage the Trust. They have a legal responsibility to manage and maintain the property, so that it can continue to provide safe and secure homes for residents for many more years to come.

The Trustees wish to appoint a paid Clerk to work alongside them. Full training, development and support will be provided. Starting salary £12.45 per hour plus paid holiday.

This is a small charity looking after just two Almshouses, so whilst there is a wide range of activities within the role, the level of work expected would be proportionate with this. Candidates will need to be able to work flexibly for approximately 5 hours each week, including attendance at quarterly evening meetings. It is likely that the actual hours required will vary across the year.

Jim's excitement culminates as a Mustang passes at low level. The Pilot spots Jim and salutes Jim salutes back while singing 'Suo Gran'

I remember the same exhilaration when as boy I stayed with my sister in Long Sutton near RAF Odiham, I discovered that it was easy to crawl under the perimeter fence at the end of the runway. I laid in the long grass at the end of the runway, and like Jim I stood up and saluted as Meteor jets flew feet above my head. A very silly thing to do I now know. After the summer break it is wonderful to be back in school, ready to learn. The term started with a whole school assembly when we read the book 'The Bad Seed' by Jory John, which promoted a discussion about our school values:


