### THE PSALMS: POETRY FOR THE SOUL

I don't know how you're feeling in this current phase of COVID-19. It feels to me like those early weeks of lockdown, when every day seems to bring a new announcement about what we can do.

As a church community, we are feeling our way into re-opening the church building, initially for private prayer and then, in due course, hopefully for services too, although I think we will be following a hybrid model of services, (people in the church building and Zoom) for some time yet.

Some of us might be looking forward to spending face to face time with others, even if 2m or 1m apart. I am looking forward to seeing my mum, who lives in Swansea, when we are once again allowed, 'over the border' into Wales! Others of us will be looking forward to visiting shops, gardens, restaurants, travelling to places further afield or getting our hair cut.

Some of us, who need to stay isolated for some reason, may find the lifting of restrictions serves as a reminder of a lack of connection. Then there will be some of us who are fearful about job security, worried about money, mourning the loss of a loved one, concerned about the well-being of our children, or just plain weary, living with the uncertainty that is our everyday experience.

The Psalms are poems, which perhaps, like our forebears, we may find a useful resource during these times. For in them we find the expression of every human emotion from despair, anger, sadness, fear to joy, hope, relief, gratitude ... and everything in between. But the Psalms don't just describe where we are now, nor do they deny the challenges. They give us the words that matter in helping express things we find hard to say, enabling us to move through the different seasons and experiences of life.

Psalm 23 is one of the most well-known Psalms, 'The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want ... God restores my soul'. In times of pandemic and protest, it grounds us in God's faithfulness, as well as God's inspiration to play our part in healing the world. It recognises that God is present in the darkness as well as light. It reminds us that even in



our dark valley, we are not alone. God is with us.

So ... however you may be feeling ... I commend the Psalms to you and pray that you may find the wisdom you need for these times. **Revd Diane**

### SPECIAL NOTICE REGARDING CHURCH REPAIRS

Good news! ### **REX TOPHAM**

Rex and Kay moved to Shoreham in 1958, setting up home in 4 The Terrace, with Rex adding an extension to create space for their three children: Fiona and Nicola born in 1959 and Kathryn in 1964. As an architect, Rex was to go on to extend many local homes in Shoreham and beyond, including the design of the 'new' vicarage in 1968. Rex sat on the Walnut Tree Trust and the Shoreham Almshouse Trust. He was a committed Christian, attending 8am services up until the month before he died. He was a church warden and reader and cared deeply about the preservation of the building. He and Kay left their home in the heart of the village in 1970 as Rex had designed his own house along the Shoreham Road. Rex gave of his time and architectural expertise continually well into his late eighties. The friendships he and Kay made in Shoreham were of enormous importance to them both.

When Fiona was killed tragically in 1977, the village and the many families within it, were a huge support. Rex is now buried with Fiona in the churchyard. He and Kay left to live in the Middle East for ten years where Rex's architectural career flourished but it was always to Shoreham they returned with great devotion. Rex came from a family steeped in art, with ancestors who had painted and etched for a living. It was thus very fitting that he and Kay had chosen to make their first Shoreham home at The Terrace opposite the Samuel Palmer School of Art. His work led him to visit much of the world and he was very aware of how lucky he had been. He and Kay travelled extensively. He died at home on 7th May, aged 90, looking out to the Shoreham hills, which he loved so dearly. *Nicola Apps and Kathryn Dymoke (nee Topham)*

### TALES FROM THE HILL

"Margaret, Becky and Susan went off to the fields to pick cowslips for the time had come to make cowslip wine. It was a cowslip day, too, a day of scents and pale gold colours, of glittering budded trees and little winds which clasped their skirts and tickled their ankles."

It was on such a day that I took my usual walk from Magpie up the Pig & Whistle path, past the ruins, now hardly visible, then through the little valley where for generations cattle have rubbed against old ash, oak and hawthorns smoothing the bark and distorting their growth. Then through Dunstall farmyard where I pause to admire the condition of the cattle and see how the winter feed has lasted. Occasionally I bump into the farm manager Dave, we chat about the weather or cattle prices. On a busy day I may encounter Bert or Cyril Higgins, we chat about the weather or the soil condition. I then make my way across the field now planted with barley. It was impossible to sow wheat last autumn because of the saturated soil. I then take the track to Warren Farm and walk along the top of the escarpment, where I can see the silver thread of the Darent snaking its way through to Shoreham.

Taking the track past the mast I look down on Otford, Sevenoaks and beyond. I abstain from resting on the rather splendid bench in memory of a gentleman who also enjoyed the view. Although perhaps I should have lingered. I continue on the track leading to Row Dow Lane past the pond that sometimes dries up in the summer. Then down through Great Wood along the path my young niece named as 'Nice Path John' while swooshing through autumn leaves. Nice path John then leads back to Magpie Bottom where the high sided cowslip banks take the unsuspecting by surprise.

Nothing much different on this day apart for a brief time where I had forgotten the troubles of the world, yes the birds seemed to sing louder and the air felt cleaner and the cowslips stood high and bent in the little wind.

### SHOREHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Since the re-opening of the tennis court a month or so ago, we have been very pleased to see so many people making use of this village facility.

Unfortunately however, very few people have been paying the suggested donation of £5 to the Village Shop despite there being a notice on the fence and despite previous requests in the Gazette. We are not looking to make a profit from the tennis court but we do need to consider the annual maintenance costs which amount to around £500 per year. It was hoped that income received from donations would cover this but this has been far from the case. We have therefore decided to introduce a booking system and an annual subscription of £20 per household for residents of Shoreham.

The new system should work as follows:

- Contact the Clerk to obtain an annual subscription at a cost of £20. On receipt of payment, you will be issued with a membership card which can be used by any member of your household.
- Check availability of the court at the village shop and book your chosen time. Please ensure that you show your membership card at the time of booking as proof of payment.
- If you do not wish to take up an annual subscription, then the cost of hiring the court will be £5 per hour. The court should be booked in the same way as above and the £5 paid directly to the shop. The £5 charge will apply to non –residents.

It is hoped that this will both increase our revenue as well as ensure fair use of play. During lockdown, many people from neighbouring towns and villages have been coming to Shoreham to make use of our 'free' facility and have been occupying the court for long stretches of time, preventing other people from using it. Signs will be put up on the gate explaining how to book so hopefully this system will ensure this doesn't happen again.

An element of honesty is still required as at this stage as we do not wish to lock the court – previous experience of locking the tennis court has resulted in extensive damage to the fences as well as padlocks and keys constantly going missing. Can I therefore please ask that all residents who wish to use the court, adhere to the new system as this way, we can ensure that this great parish facility remains with us for many years to come.

### A NEW FUTURE FOR PRESTON FARM

In autumn last year, I moved to Preston Farm in the Darent Valley, just north-east of Shoreham. I feel incredibly lucky to now call it home, along with my wife, Jesse, and our three kids, Tabitha, Eliza and Bo.

It's been a busy first 9 months for us here at the farm... We have refurbished Dairy House, and are now tackling the much bigger project of the old Farmhouse. We have welcomed some new family members - Luna the dog and two colonies of honey bees - and we've been investing in our passion for the environment and conservation, working with The Woodland Trust, the Darent Valley Landscape Partnership and Kent Wildlife Trust on a number of projects that we hope will turn Preston Farm into a haven for wildlife.

Over the past few months, I have been working with a small team of consultants to explore the potential to develop our old farmyard into a 'work hub' to support small businesses and provide local people with an alternative to working from home, or commuting into the City. We had hoped to organise and invite you to a drop-in session at Shoreham Village Hall to discuss our proposal with you in person, but due to lockdown restrictions and not wanting to put anyone at unnecessary risk, doing this 'virtually' felt like the most sensible option. ### THE SHOREHAM SOCIETY

Here's another walk for you to try.

#### The Crinkle Crankle Walk

From the High Street, go past The Crown pub and turn left up the Millennium Path, just opposite Mill Lane. Go through the kissing gate and turn right up to the second five bar gate where you turn left on to The Terrace. After 75yards by the green barrier take the right fork towards Pilots Wood. After about a mile, there is a junction where you take the left fork. (The right turn goes towards the pedestrian bridge over the motorway.)

Follow left down the steps, keeping to the fence until you reach the open ground of the "Polhill Bank "nature reserve. Keep to the right as you go down the hill and you will arrive at some steps down to Filston Lane. Cross the road and take the footpath which will take you behind Sepham Farm. And here is the Crinkle Crankle Wall! Why was it built like a snake?

At the footpath junction, turn left and follow the path to Filston Farm, following on to Filston Lane. Here you can choose, depending on how tired you are! Back up the Sound of Music Hill, right along the Terrace, with a right turn down to the Recreation Ground through the Tony Whitworth gate or turn right down Water Lane to follow the walk through the cricket ground and golf course OR straight back along Filston Lane for an ice cream from the Village Shop!

#### **Trash or Treasure?**

Your trash might be treasure for me! The lock down has been a great opportunity for clearing out and already things are being given away on our Facebook page. ### LYCH GATE




To pass into the churchyard you go through the lych gate where traditionally coffins were rested and the pall bearers would shelter. The gate was built by George Wood in 1863 when he was parish clerk and a renowned craftsman in wood.

The gold lettering was restored by the late John Allen of Shoreham Place more than 25 years ago and has stood the test of time. The church street entrance wording is "Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord" and from the Church side "I am the Resurrection saith the Lord".

The present gates were restored using a bequest to the Church by Joy Saynor, great village historian and co-author of "Shoreham a Village in Kent". Her name is on one of the gates.

The gates were made as an exact replica of the old ones by Ian Potter of Valley View Joinery of Eynsford and all the existing ironwork, to the top of the gates and hinges were rubbed down cleaned and repainted and used on the new gates, the bolts to the gate posts were remade by Rhys Harlin from Darenth Valley Forge. *Ann Ball*
