



I was watching a three year old boy potting up a spring bulb in compost at the Churchrun parent toddler group 'Stay and Play'. And it got me thinking. Isn't it appropriate that Easter comes at a time when we in the Northern Hemisphere are seeing signs of spring all around us?

The death and resurrection of Jesus is perfectly mirrored in the way that plants and shrubs die in the autumn and – seemingly miraculously – come back to life in the spring.

Did those who set the dates for Easter plan it that way? Well, possibly, but in a very roundabout way. The date of Easter is determined by the date of Passover. Passover is a widely celebrated Jewish holiday that remembers the Hebrews' exodus from Egypt. It lasts for eight days, beginning on the 15th day of the first month of the Jewish year, the month of Nisan. Jews calculate their calendar according to the phases of the moon. Thus of course the date of the festival moves around with the moon's cycle.

So what's the link with Easter? Well we know from the Gospels that the Passover festival was due to begin when Jesus made his triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday: that's why there were so many people around. The Last Supper, which we remember on Maundy Thursday, was a 'Seder meal': a traditional meal the night before the start of Passover. And we read in John's Gospel that the Jewish leaders asked Pilate to speed up the death of Jesus and the others being crucified so that they could be buried before the Passover proper began.

So the date of Easter is effectively set by the very ancient Jewish calendar, and specifically by the date of the first month of their year, Nisan. It seems reasonable to think that the originators of that calendar would have put the first month in the spring. So yes, there probably is a link between Easter and springtime.

Either way, please join us this Easter as we remember – with countless other churches around the world – the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross and the amazing events of the resurrection. There will be our usual procession on Palm Sunday. On Good Friday we will have a quiet reflective service with readings and hymns from 2-3pm, remembering Jesus' last hour at the cross. On Sunday morning we will be at the cross on the hill at dawn, meeting at the Landway at 5.30am. And at 10am there will be the main event in Church to celebrate the resurrection.





LOOKING FOR LIZARDS





Common lizard

April is one of the best times of year to search for reptiles such as lizards as they are getting active in the spring but need to bask a lot to warm up and so can be quite easy to spot. Reptiles are **poikilothermic**, meaning that their internal temperature varies, depending on the weather, as opposed to **homeothermic** animals like us, who can maintain a nearly constant internal temperature. These characteristics used to be called cold or warm blooded. In the spring reptiles need to be warmed in order to be active, but later in the year, when the weather is hotter, they do not need to come out into the open where predators might find them and may actually need to shelter to cool down.

Churchyards can be brilliant for all reptiles because they contain a mixture of warm places to bask such as stones and short grass, which are usually close to places where they can shelter such as gaps and cracks within stone walls, long and tussocky grass, uneven ground with holes and also larger gaps within the joints of monuments such as chest tombs. Churchyards are also rich in invertebrate food, in part due to the absence of chemicals such as pesticides.

When searching for lizards look several metres ahead of where you are walking, going slowly and quietly. Reptiles can pick up vibrations from sudden movement and are aware of shadows falling on them. Search on flat stones and south-facing banks of short grass, close to good hiding places. First light is the best time, when they are cold and need the warmth of the sun. Lift flat stones and pieces of wood to search for slowworms (a lizard without legs), who often 'bask' underneath something that will transmit heat. Roofing felt is a favourite and you can put half metre squares of this out if you want to search for slowworms. Give them a few weeks to discover the felt squares then peep under them at the start and end of the day. Please let us know if you spot any of these fascinating reptiles in your churchyard.

GEORGE ORWELL IN SHOREHAM

One Sunday morning towards the end of World War II a tall, gaunt, moustachioed figure dressed in shabby but well-cut clothes that he liked people to call 'disgraceful' alighted at Shoreham station: the political commentator and then still minor novelist, George Orwell. He had come to spend the day at Lord Dunsany's Dunstall Priory, the weekend

retreat of his London friend, the Tory novelist Anthony Powell, and the wartime home of Powell's wife, Lady Violet, who was Lord Dunsany's niece, and their son, Tristram.

It was an unlikely friendship, to say the least – Orwell once said that Powell was the only Tory he had ever liked – but one most easily explained by the fact that they were both old Etonians. It began one day in 1941, at the Café Royal in Regent Street, when the writer Inez Holden invited Powell and Lady Violet to join her, Orwell and Orwell's wife, Eileen, at their table after lunch. Powell was dressed in full Brigade of Guards blues, and approached Orwell with some trepidation, fearing his disapproval. "Do your trousers strap under the foot?" Orwell asked him. "Yes," replied Powell. "That's the really important thing," said Orwell, who had been an officer in the Burma Police. "Those straps under the foot give you a feeling like nothing else in life."

Presumably, when Orwell alighted at Shoreham, Powell met him off the train, and no doubt Orwell – never one for small talk – immediately launched into a discussion of some weighty matter of the day, as was his wont. After that, all we know is that they went for a long walk, presumably after lunch, during which Orwell, recalled Powell, took great pains to excuse the frivolity of their ramblings by commenting with intense seriousness on everything they saw. "Interesting to note the regional variation in latching the field gates," Orwell remarked at one point. "Different even in the same county."


