

LIGHT and HEAT

Light ... Our Christmas Tree, with its lights, is still up. At home and in church. So is the star. On the basis that many of us struggle (me included), with the lack of light at this time of year, Candlemas on the 2nd February provides us with the ideal excuse to keep those lights shining a bit longer.

Candlemas is a pivotal turning point in the Christian year, as we turn from the 'crib' to the 'cross'. It is also the midpoint of winter, halfway between the shortest day, and the spring equinox. On this day, Christians remember the presentation of Jesus in the temple, 40 days after his birth, as was the Jewish custom.

It was the day of the year, when all the candles, that were to be used in the church during the coming year, were brought into church, and a blessing was said over them. For Christians, candles are a sign of hope, they were and still are a reminder that Jesus came, as a light in the darkness; with a message that the light of the world is always with us.

Heat ... Many of you will know that the church heating is not working, and probably won't be for some weeks. As well as fixing the boiler, we are also exploring additional heating, thanks to some generous legacy money. This complementary heating focuses on heating the person rather than the space.

I'm not the only vicar who has had to grapple with heating, as this extract from Alain's (nearly finished) book reads: 'The comfort of the parishioners in church was an important consideration for the Vicar. In December 1913 he was glad to be able to announce that a new heating system had been put in the church and that the cold conditions which he had previously written about had vanished. David Madge publicly expressed the hope that people would no longer give the lack of warmth in the church as a reason for staying away from church.'

Of course, we are now fortunate enough to have the Church Room, which, when numbers allow, is where we are holding church services. It

TALES FROM THE HILL

If you have walked through Magpie Bottom recently you might have had a shock, Kent Wildlife Trust have employed a contractor to cut down the ash trees that could pose a danger to the public if they fell across the road or footpaths as a result of Ash Dieback disease. Although I was aware that it was Kent Wildlife Trust intention to fell these trees as I had seen the red markers sprayed onto the trees that indicated they were due to be felled, it still came as quite a shock to see and hear many venerable trees come crashing to the ground The scale of the works exceeds the damage caused by the '87 storm. Meanwhile it looks a mess, let's hope many of the remaining Ashes will survive, and the damage to the chalk grass land is not too great. Do take care if you are walking on footpaths 24 & 25 as the heavy machinery has left them in a treacherous condition.

There is a further issue that concerns us namely the spread of invasive species on the banks, especially hawthorn, dog wood, and blackthorn, areas that we managed, over the years, to keep clear for orchids, cowslips and other chalk loving plants to prosper. I am meeting with the CEO of KWT to discuss the matter.

SHOREHAM HISTORICAL SOCIETY

In January, Dr Charles Shee gave our annual Lothian Lecture, which is always on a medical topic. Dr Shee gave an excellent illustrated talk on the History of Tuberculosis - the so-called White Death that in 1815 killed a quarter of England's population. It found a diminishing number of victims well into the 20th century, and still kills 1.5 million people around the world each year. Everything from "foul air" to "immodest dress" were thought to be the cause of TB in the 19th century until the bacillus behind it was discovered in 1882. In 1944, streptomycin was the first of several drugs that were found to provide a cure.

ELIZABETH HULBERT

Elizabeth Hulbert lived at Timberden Farm Cottage in Shacklands Road and she sadly passed away peacefully in her sleep on 9th November aged 102. She moved to Shoreham in 1973 with her husband Kenneth, buying what were then two small terraced farm cottages which they knocked together, adding an extension at the back to make an attractive four-bedroom home with beautiful roses at the front. When Kenneth, who was an orthopaedic surgeon, retired they become involved in Shoreham village life. They were regulars at local history society events and attended WEA classes in art history where they joined other Shoreham residents on cultural trips, one they talked about often was the Vermeer exhibition at The Hague. Elizabeth's daughter Anne still has the essays she wrote on the course, all in a perfect italic script. (Those were the days before computers when people actually used things called pens!)

Elizabeth came originally from East Yorkshire, born into a family steeped in Methodism. After an early career working as a domestic science teacher and matron at a boarding school she married Kenneth in 1946 following a whirlwind romance.

The family moved to Petts Wood in 1950 and became heavily involved in the life of Orpington Methodist Church. Elizabeth was a director of the Methodist Recorder for many years and became President of the Shaftesbury Society (now the charity Livability) in 1977. But her greatest love was always family life. She had three children, Anne, Jane (died in 1999) and John, seven grandchildren and five great grandchildren. People will remember her warmth, humour, unbounded energy and flair for entertaining - all done with effortless charm. Anyone visiting the house would be guaranteed a warm welcome along with an immaculately laid tea trolley with chocolate biscuits.
