

Jesus said..."Greater love has no man than this – that he gives up his life for his friends" I think Remembrance Sunday is one of the most important services in the Christian year - a time when, as a nation, we stop to "remember" those who gave up their lives in wars across more than 100 years for the peace and freedom we enjoy today.

We honour them all, for everything they gave up and everything they did and for the sacrifices they made on our behalf. We also give thanks for those who returned home and their families.

Remembrance Sunday celebrates the peace that their sacrifices bought – it is worth remembering that the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month was the date in 1918 of the signing of the armistice which was to bring the end of the World War 1!

But whilst rightly we honour those who died, we must not forget those who are still suffering as a result of war.

Recently we saw a celebration of the indomitable spirit of some of those young men and women in the Invictus Games but I've also seen the other side of the coin - ex-soldiers at a Church-run night shelter – several suffering from PTSD, many unable to get a job, all homeless on London streets.

A very vital part of Remembrance Sunday is that it raises money for the work of the Royal British Legion in helping and supporting forces personnel, and alleviating suffering among veterans and their families

A former Bishop of Birmingham, Leonard Wilson, who was a Japanese prisoner of war in World War 2, recommended three thoughts for us all to carry in our hearts on Remembrance Sunday.

It has been lovely to enjoy some warm weather this late in the year, enabling our children to make the most of the field and Speller's Woods at break and lunchtimes. We are so lucky to have such large, beautiful grounds and I always find great joy when in the woods as they are so tranquil and atmospheric. The monies raised by FOSS (Friends of Shoreham School) have been used to bring life to our little pond again, meaning the children can explore it for educational purposes; we are now in the process of trying to re-fence the area and any support from the village would be most welcome.

We were pleased to welcome the Shoreham 'Over 60s' to our Harvest afternoon tea event and I was extremely proud of our Year 6 pupils who spoke to them with confidence and performed 'Harvest Rock n Roll'. One of our guests wrote a thank you card after her visit which included the words, "I enjoyed every minute of my visit as the children were so wonderfully attentive." What a lovely and fitting accolade for our eldest pupils.

It was a great pleasure to accompany Cameron Class on their school trip to the British Museum to see the Benin Bronzes and then on to the National Gallery to participate in a workshop on landscapes. The children were able to compare and contrast the artefacts from Ancient Egypt to the Benin Bronzes, and also to give their reasons for or against the argument that the Bronzes should be returned to Nigeria rather than kept in the British Museum.

HARVESTING FROM THE ALLOTMENTS

Traditionally this is the time of year when we celebrate the harvest. However, when you have the delights of growing your own you can be harvesting throughout the year and from mid-summer until mid-autumn you can be harvesting and storing. I like to think of this as our 'insurance policy' for the winter. Jeremy and I have two allotments, although Jeremy is most definitely the Chief Grower! Between us we grow lots of fruit, flowers, herbs and yummy veggies.

Throughout winter and early spring we are harvesting goodies such as lovely Brussels sprouts (they really are lovely), cabbages, broccoli, leeks, beetroot, turnips, parsnips, spinach, chard and kale.

As spring progresses we have the delights of harvesting lettuce, radishes, over wintered onions and shallots, broad beans, rhubarb and the spinach, chard and kale keep on giving! Added to this we are harvesting beautiful tulips and daffodils.

Summer heralds the wonderful harvest of soft fruit. Raspberries, blackcurrants, redcurrants and gooseberries are all picked and topped and tailed, usually in front of the television! Much is frozen for culinary treats yet to come. At this time of year we are also harvesting French beans, runner beans, courgettes, carrots, tomatoes, peppers, beetroot and wonderful potatoes, and the spinach, chard and kale keep on giving! This too is the time when the sweet peas, sunflowers and dahlias begin to colour our home. As summer progresses into autumn the carrots, beetroot and potatoes continue. Added to this interestingly shaped squashes start to be harvested and, of, course, the spinach, chard and kale keep on giving, as do the sweet peas, sunflowers and dahlias. Everything is grown with love, grown organically and absolutely no chemicals. However, none of this could happen if we didn't have our kitchen, study and greenhouse full of chitting potatoes and tender seedlings during the winter and early spring months. Luckily for them, and for us, it is a very happily shared space! Fancy giving it a go? You don't have to start big; quarter and half plots are available. SHOREHAM VILLAGE PLAYERS REMEMBERED

In Memoriam; Lorna Lee 10 July 1930 – 6 September 2023 -

Lorna and Gordon Lee were active in more than fifteen productions between them in the Shoreham Village Players across a span of five decades, starting in the mid-1950s and not hanging up the grease paint and dog-eared play-scripts until the early 1990s. They also served on its committee for many years.

Lorna was a keen actor at school and then at University in Exeter, where she met Gordon – five years older and demobbed after fighting the Japanese in Burma. Gordon had never stepped on any stage when they moved to Shoreham in 1954. Yet the family myth goes that Lorna was so dissatisfied by the first Players' production she was involved in, that she came home and declared that Gordon could do a better job as producer.

She was persuasive, and so it seems was he to the Village Players' Committee. They trusted him (though relatively new to the village) to put on Shakespeare's *Twelfth Night*, on twelfth night 1956, with Lorna in the leading role of Viola. It was a success and several other productions followed over the next ten years. Gordon never did act – he directed, often with Lorna in the cast.

He emphasised keeping up a good pace in productions. His mantra was "The seats in the Village Hall are very hard."

A wonderful ensemble of amateur talent formed around these shows at that time. Susan Platts a gifted painter produced beautiful scenery to transform the Village Hall's modest stage. Richard Butterworth and Peter Walker were stalwart and gifted amateur actors with natural presence and great charm. Stage Management, Lighting, Sound and ticket sales were typically in the hands of a regular team who knew their roles and discharged them well. The plays were popular and the reviews complimentary. It was a wonderful community instance of the whole amounting to so much more than the sum of its parts.

There was room for young and old:

"Fags out girls, we're on", was apparently the injunction backstage by Peaseblossom to her fellow teenage fairies before they had to go on to minister to Bottom at Titania's command in Shakespeare's Midsummer Night's Dream. Every facet of village life was represented — Dudley Benbow, Shoreham's vicar, took part; while Lord Dunsany President of the Shoreham Village Players wrote a one act play The Road in 1956 as part of the battle to keep what would become the M25 from being driven through the heart of Shoreham.

Other notable productions of that era included, Shakespeare's *Merchant of Venice, The Ghost Train*, the thriller *Dead on Nine*, and *Journey's End*. This last being all male, Lorna did the make-up. It must have been a powerful evocation of war to an audience in 1966, barely twenty years after the end of conflict in Europe and when many older village residents would have had vivid personal memories of its First World War setting. One night when the thunder-flashes for the end of the play's final bombardment scene failed to sound on cue, in a panic they were inadvertently all let off at once and in so doing they did very nearly actually bring the house down!

Gordon went on to direct a Victorian Music Hall evening in 1973 after he and Lorna had moved from Shoreham to Otford. Lorna appeared on the bill singing *My Old Man Said Follow the Van*. She continued acting with the Players – taking the lead in *Saturday, Sunday, Monday*, and in 1992 appearing in the Player's second production of Noel Coward's *Blithe Spirit*. That same year she directed a very successful production of *Murder in the Cathedral* in Shoreham Church.

Lorna bowed out from the Players in 1993 after producing another Music Hall evening, as Gordon had done twenty years before. By this stage their own marriage was over, the partnership that had been so productive in the 1950s and early 1960s dissolved in divorce. Gordon died in November 2001 aged 76 from the long term effects of type 2 diabetes. Lorna lived to be 93, dying peacefully on 6 September 2023.
