






#### Is Remembrance Sunday Outdated?

The First World war ended 107 years ago. There are only 8,000 people alive who fought in the Second World War. And casualties in subsequent wars — while devastating for those affected - were comparatively light. Some people object to what they see as the militaristic overtones of the commemorations. Hence the existence of white poppies, first worn as early as 1933.

Is it time to stop looking back? Is Remembrance Sunday a slightly self-indulgent time of maudlin reflection over the tragic deaths of young men who would be amazed that we still remember them? Wouldn't it be better if our time and attention were devoted to current peace initiatives rather than long-dead heroes?

There is no doubting that there is still huge public support for the commemorations. Children are taught about it at school. It is pretty much compulsory for politicians and TV presenters to wear poppies in early November. The Royal British Legion will raise over £160m to help military veterans. Our Church will, we can be sure, be packed as usual on Remembrance Sunday at 10am. More people will join us at the War Memorial at 10.45. And millions will tune in on TV to watch the proceedings at the Cenotaph.

What's the attraction? Maybe there is a degree of sentimentality, but I want to suggest that there is much more to it than that. At a time when our society seems so fractured, the commemorations provide some glue holding us together in a shared civic memory of cataclysmic events in our nation's past. At a time when rituals of observance are so rare — at least for non-churchgoers — the familiar hymns, the 2 minutes' silence and the Last Post fill a gap that we didn't realise we felt. And at a time when most of us have been so incredibly lucky as to avoid major wars in our lifetime, the commemorations give us a chance to reflect on our good fortune and give thanks.

What about the present and future though? Well, in Church on 9<sup>th</sup> November we will not just be looking back. We will be thinking about the many conflicts in our world at the moment. And of course praying to Jesus, our Prince of Peace, that a just peace would prevail. Hope to see you there!



## PUBLIC MEETING AND AGM – FRIDAY 7TH NOVEMBER – VILLAGE HALL 7.30PM TOM HART-DYKE ON THE WORLD GARDEN AT LULLINGSTONE CASTLE

We have an excellent speaker lined up for our Annual General Meeting on 7<sup>th</sup> November. He is **Tom Hart-Dyke, who created the amazing World Garden at Lullingstone Castle.** Tom is a serious plant enthusiast and collector, and has a remarkable story to tell, not least his experience of being kidnapped when on a plant collecting trip in the Darien Gap (Columbia) in 2000.

The Lullingstone World Garden has been the subject of several BBC TV programmes. Today, it is almost like a miniature Kew Gardens, containing fascinating plants from all over the world. There is a particularly scary collection of cacti. Tom's knowledge of plants is enormous, and the event will certainly appeal to all gardeners and those interested in the natural environment. We hope to follow up this event with a guided visit to the World Garden next year.

All are welcome – you don't have to be a member to attend! There will also be an update on the Farming Year and on the work of the Kent Downs National Landscape (formerly AONB) team. The brief AGM will include a report of what the Shoreham Society has been up to in the past year as well as the formal business and an open session for members. And, of course, there will be the usual cakes and refreshments.

#### SHOREHAM SHINE – THANK YOU

A big thank you to the 26 villagers and friends who helped make our village even lovelier on 11<sup>th</sup> October. There was a lot of litter picking – especially from the verges of the local roads as well as weeding, cutting back of vegetation – and removal of yet more tree guards from the woods. The workers were rewarded with some yummy cakes – the Guinness and Chocolate cake was notable. Shoreham Shine takes place twice a year, usually in October and March, so do join up again next year.

#### CARDIOPULMONARY RESUSICATION (CPR) / DEFIB TRAINING

Over 15 people joined the training courses on 11<sup>th</sup> October. We learnt what to do if a person collapses with a cardiac arrest and is not breathing. After calling 999, you start chest compressions immediately. Mouth to mouth breathing is no longer part of the procedure. The emergency operator will give you the code for the Defibrillator if one is available, and the machine includes voice instructions. We were able to try CPR on a dummy (hard work!) and given hands-on instruction in use of a Defibrillator. The course was organised by the excellent **Sevenoaks CPR Charity** (contacts on Facebook) and part paid for by the Shoreham Society.

#### **NEWS FROM SHOREHAM VILLAGE SCHOOL – OCTOBER 2025**

It has been another busy and positive month at Shoreham Village School, full of learning, creativity and community connections. The children have been exploring new topics, taking part in exciting trips and showcasing their wonderful talents — all while our staff continue to ensure the highest standards of care and safety for everyone. The completion of our new perimeter fencing is a welcome improvement to the security of the school site. Designed to be sympathetic to the character of our lovely village school, it provides a safe, secure environment while blending naturally into the surroundings.

Our pupils have been out and about making the most of hands-on learning experiences. Barton Class enjoyed their first school trip of the year to Swanley Library, where they listened to stories, explored shelves of new books and learned about how libraries work. Even though the trains there and back were cancelled, the children's smiles didn't fade — they filled the time with songs, snacks and stories. Back in class, they have been exploring repeating patterns in maths and beginning to blend sounds in phonics.

Palmer Class had a fantastic day at the Sea Life Centre in London, where their science learning came to life. In class, they have been busy investigating floating and sinking materials and learning about buoyancy. In maths, they have been ordering numbers and using the greater than, less than and equal to symbols with growing confidence. There has also been plenty of creative play in the mud kitchen, with children designing their own imaginative 'recipes'.


Moore Class have been honing their persuasive writing skills with adverts warning of the dangers of meeting strangers online. In science, they've been learning about what plants need to survive — including photosynthesis, chlorophyll and the vital role of pollinators such as bees and butterflies. Their art lessons have seen the creation of beautiful colour wheels, while music lessons have been full of rhythm and creativity as they compose their own Stone Age-inspired pieces.

Cameron Class have been diving deep into the structure of numbers, exploring addition and subtraction through problem-solving and reasoning. In English, pupils have completed their autobiographies and are now writing stories for the BBC's 500 Words Competition. In Dance, they've perfected their Haka routine — complete with some impressive new sequences!

Our Year 6 pupils continue to shine as caring buddies, setting an excellent example of kindness and leadership across the school. Meanwhile, our Sports Captains have taken part in leadership training, designing their own team games and preparing to share them with other pupils soon.

Finally, a huge thank you to everyone who supported our children's artwork at the *Our Shoreham* exhibition — from Spitfire sculptures to blossom trees inspired by Samuel Palmer, their creativity was a joy to see. As always, Shoreham Village School continues to be a place filled with energy, enthusiasm, and community pride.

We are hosting Open Days for prospective families over the next few weeks, and we still have some limited spaces for pupils available in some year groups, so if you know anyone who is looking for a small friendly school with high standards and lots of lovely outdoor space, please ask them to call us to arrange a tour. 

My 'Harvest Report' last year began with a reminder of just how WET the weather had been in Spring 2024. What a difference a year makes! You will not need me to remind you that Spring 2025 was the complete opposite with extended DRY conditions.

My Castle Farm rain gauge recorded....

- 355mm or 14" of rain in the 4 months, February May 2024
- 80mm or 3" in the same 4 months in 2025

This meant that garden lawns required less mowing this year. Similarly grass crops on farms did not grow as much as normal – resulting less grass for animals to graze and significantly smaller hay and silage summer harvests. Forage gathered and stored for livestock to eat during the approaching winter has, on some farms, already had to be fed to cows to maintain milk production or to lambs and cattle to keep them growing.

Forage shortages are even more acute in the Midlands and the East of the country, resulting in some farmers being forced to buy in expensive silage or having to sell animals to reduce feed consumption over winter.

A prolonged lack of rainfall combined with hot temperatures quickly dried soils. Crops respond in different ways to a lack of moisture - growing less, flowering earlier and ripening prematurely. Lavender flowered a week early with a good oil yield, whilst our combine harvester began cutting on 1 July – one of the earliest starts I can ever recall.

'Variability' was a key feature of this year's harvest. Cereal yields varied in different regions across England and districts within Kent. Yields varied between different farms locally and even varied more than usual between fields on the same farm.

Exactly when, where and how much rain fell caused some of this variation. Best quality soils retain moisture for longer, which can be the difference between grains swelling rather than shrivelling during a dry June. Autumn-sown crops develop longer, stronger roots before winter, so have a greater resilience to drying soils, making them less stressed than beans, linseed, barley or other spring-sown crops. In summary, the low rainfall resulted in disappointing, below average quantity of arable yields but helpfully, fine weather during the actual harvest period itself meant good grain quality.

Potatoes, peas, brassicas and salad vegetable growers faced similar challenges of responding to dry weather. In these crops, irrigation often plays an essential role in maintaining consistent and predictable field production, thus ensuring adequate daily veg supplies into supermarkets. Strawberries, cherries, plums and apples have all loved the sunshine and warmth, making 2025 a great, perhaps a bumper year for fruits of all type.

September rains were very welcome and followed by a prolonged settled period allowing arable farmers to push on with Autumn sowings for 2026 in ideal conditions. Grape harvesting locally is now complete, having benefitted from warm, dry days, delivering a promise of 2025 being a great vintage for the ever-expanding English wine sector.

In nature trees and shrubs have also delivered what is known as a 'mast' year – by producing an exceptionally prolific crop of fruits, acorns, nuts and seeds – far in excess of normal autumn output. This phenomenon is believed to be a natural strategy for some species to survive and thrive, overwhelming predators, such as squirrels, birds and mice, by providing them with more seeds than they can ever eat.
