

MPWAPWA ... AGAIN.

I am writing this in Pembrokeshire, not far from the coast at the tail end of the second storm we have experienced recently. It seems that all over the world people are experiencing more extremes and unpredictability in the weather.

You may remember that in November we sent some money to help with the drought in Mpwapwa in Tanzania, where we have our link parish and schools. The drought (when it should have been the rainy season), meant that the seeds that had already been planted failed to grow, and people had no choice but to eat the seeds that should have been set aside to plant for this year's harvest. We have just received thanks for the gift to alleviate the impact of the failed harvest.

There is no welfare state, so most of the practical, environmental and social support comes through the church. For example, the diocese has been responsible for planting trees to help mitigate some of the impacts of deforestation. Bishop Jacob used the funds, to give two bags of maize seed to each of the pastors and leaders across the diocese. Two bags is enough seed to plant an acre of maize. All the seed has now been planted, the rain has come and the crop will be harvested in three months. It has been wonderful to see the photos of smiling faces holding bags of maize, children at Chunyu Secondary school involved in the planting of the seeds, and latterly, photos of the crops growing well.

Our Mpwapwa Working Group (with children and adults from Shoreham Village School, St. Michael's School and the parish) has continued to meet to explore ways we can support and learn from our partnership in Chunyu. I'm delighted to be able to tell you that I (Alain and Joseph), will be making a return visit to Mpwapwa in May.

We have paid to take out four extra suitcases, which we hope to fill with things that are needed by our friends in Chunyu. We would also like to take out some money, for the two schools and parish. Can you help us ... do you have a large old suitcase (or even 4!), that we could leave out there ... could you donate some money (via SVS or the church) to enable us to buy things, pay for the excess baggage, leave small gifts of money ... and when we find out what would be helpful to take, could you help us fill the four suitcases

TALES FROM THE HILL

On Saturday mornings 'The Ice Man Cometh' carrying a large block of ice that dripped its way through the kitchen into a double-doored cold cabinet. There it would melt its way through the week, in high summer seldom lasting till Wednesday, but it kept perishables fresh for a few days. To me the ice man was a sinister spectre, layers of sacks on his back to protect him from the cold, his only equipment a rope and a large hook that dug into the ice. The ice block was the size of a microwave, you touched it at your peril, of course as a curious boy I had to try licking it, and several cups of hot water were required to free my tongue from its icy grasp, minus a layer of skin from my tongue.

Two hundred years ago ice was a precious commodity, so valuable that big estates realized that storage of meats, poultry and fish packed in ice or kept close to it would prolong the shelf life along with many other perishables. By the mid-19th century an ice house was de rigeur for every large country house. As the fashion grew so did the uses for good quality ice, such as a bed for salads, ice cream and exotic fruits, even ice sculptures.

The construction of ice houses varied. Some were grand structures, embellished with fine stonework and statues. Others no more than an egg shaped underground brick chambers, with a porch leading into the side of the dome. They were often roofed with thick thatch. The chamber could measure 30ft in depth and 12 ft wide holding 25 ton of ice.

A few big estates had shallow ice ponds where men and women would cut ice slabs to fill the house, but mostly the ice was taken from local ponds. It was hard dangerous cold work, frostbite and even drownings were common. When the cart arrived at the Ice House it had to be broken and twigs and weeds removed from the slabs.

Ice houses were often built in a dark and shady part of the gardens. When fridges arrived on the scene most Ice Houses were put to other uses such as water tanks or even cesspools and in at least one case an air raid shelter----A chilling thought!

Thank you to everyone who entered the competition to design a Village Sign for Shoreham. We had a great response and received some fantastic entries, many of which came from children. FROM THE ARCHIVES

March 1890

There was a real controversy in the village over the dispersal of funds from Terry's Charity with strongly held views on all sides in this dispute. In the report of the public meeting held to discuss this issue it was reported in the parish magazine that the Vicar had said that "it was wrong to have come upon him in the dark in the churchyard; it looked like an attempt to overawe an individual by a superior display of force and not being a jelly fish ... he had spoken his mind (in the meeting)"

March 1900

The country was embroiled in the cost of maintaining its empire with the Boer War in South Africa. The Church door had a list of those from the village who were serving their country in this conflict. The Vicar was pleased with recent military successes which he attributed to God's blessing. Closer to home there was growing excitement that the cricket pavilion would soon be completed thanks to the financial generosity of the Cohens of Highfields and the agreement of the Mildmays to this being built on their estate.

March 1924

There were details of a very fit local man in that month's issue of the parish magazine. His name was Isaac Loveland who really loved long distance walking. He had already walked from Shoreham to Land's End when a younger man. At the age of 64 he walked 50 miles in one day, managing 22 miles in a single day, even at the age of 80.

March 1990

Some things never change as there was an article in the Gazette about the problem of dog mess, especially the pavement stretch from the King's Arms to the High Street. The dog warden had been contacted and locals were urged to report a description of the dog, not the owner, to the Shoreham School office.
