

According to author Emily Bronte, 'May is the month of hope'. But hope seems to be in short supply as we go into May 2025.

We live in troubling times with many concerned about what the future might hold. Pensions and savings have been hit by President Trump's tariff manipulations; uncompromising powers continue to devastate Ukraine and Gaza risking world peace; across the southern hemisphere man-made and natural disasters leave millions homeless and starving – while many governments (including our own) are looking to cut back on overseas aid to prioritise defence spending. Meanwhile at home April's price hikes affect all of us but particularly those already running on threadbare budgets. No wonder the foodbanks are struggling to keep up with demand.

As individuals there seems so little we can do, except, if we can manage it, buy a few extra packets and tins to put into the local food bank and give a bit more to charities working in poorer countries... and of course, if you are a person of faith, to pray.

I know that some will ask is there any point in praying. As a neighbour said to me last week.... 'If there is a God up there I don't think he's listening'.

Well there is... and he does!

The story is told of Hudson Taylor, the missionary, who was on a sailing ship to China. The ship was becalmed, and slowly drifting toward an island inhabited by cannibals.

In desperation, the captain asked Taylor to pray for the help of God. 'I will,' said Taylor, 'provided you set your sails to catch the breeze.'

Despite his doubts the skipper did what Hudson told him. Hudson left the deck and shut himself away in a cabin to pray. A while later while he was still praying, he heard the Captain's voice calling 'Are you still praying?' ... 'Yes.'

'Well, you better stop, the wind is tearing the sails apart!'"

Every time we pray, we should pray in hope, but also in faith - 'sure of things hoped for' – always accepting that God's response may not be the one we want – it may be a different response or none at all (if it's not in our best interests). God's greatest gift can be an unanswered prayer!

Over the years when I've had answers to prayer, friends have explained them away as coincidence. William Temple who was Archbishop of Canterbury during World War Two wrote ... 'I'm amazed when I pray how often coincidences happen'.

A few years back with an ageing and reducing membership, the Church was urged to pray for more young people. Recently the Bible Society published research from 2024 showing a significant rise in the number of young people reporting belief in God and attending church in England and Wales.

Coincidence? I think not!

Calling children of all ages to Shoreham's biggest annual event. It's the Duck Race on Sunday 11 May!

Your first job is to make or decorate your own duck.

The best ones will be put on display, and you can win an award for style. Please use your imagination and skill to make your own duck (or ducks). Be as creative as you can! Special award for a sustainable (non plastic) duck.

The race starts at the Bridge, which is where you come to register your duck. **Duck Registration takes place between 1.30 and 2.20pm.** Volunteers will give you a form to fill in your details. If you bring your own duck, it costs £2 to register. If you don't have your own, you can buy an Orphan Duck for an extra £2. Each duck is given a number which you need to note to see if your duck wins.

A team of helpers puts the ducks in the river behind a barrier, and the **race starts at about 2.30pm.** The winning post is by the footbridge near the bottom of Mill Lane. There are medals and certificates for the winner. The Duckmaster is William Alexander of Castle Farm, who arrives in the Duckmobile and oversees the race. He also checks the river in advance for obstructions.

While you are waiting, special **Duck Biscuits, cakes and drinks will be on sale.** Friends of Shoreham School (FOSS) will also be selling ice creams and cakes.

Every year, the money raised by the Duck Race goes to support a village activity or good cause. This year, we are supporting Shoreham Pre-School which is attended by many of our village children.

If you can, please persuade your friends and family, if travelling from further afield, to leave their cars behind, to reduce congestion. On Sunday 11th, trains will only be running to Shoreham from Swanley and Sevenoaks, with connections to Victoria and Charing Cross respectively. If you do come by car, it is hoped that parking will be possible in the Heavy Horse Field.

We need many helpers on the day – please get in touch as there are many different jobs to do. A lot of work goes on behind the scenes. Please contact Chris Euman (christineeuman@yahoo.co.uk) if you'd like to join the team – young and old welcome!

VILLAGE VE DAYS GONE BY

“All the lights shone out in Shoreham – no more black-out, and the church was floodlit. We knew we could sleep in peace that night for the first time for five long years.”

Such was Mollie Lewis’s memory of VE Day on 8th May 1945, which featured a village parade, a children’s party in the Village Hall and a ceremony by the Cross on the Hill. The young Ray Cornwell made the most of the offerings in the Hall – “a plate with one sandwich on it and I think we had a choice, one sausage roll, one mince pie and then a little cup with a jelly in it. We thought this a terrific party at the time.” Sixty years later, in 2005, Ray took part in another VE Day commemoration which involved a ceremony led by the British Legion, the presentation of peace roses by children to veterans, a play about living through the Blitz, and a remarkable reunion of those from near and far who had been at the school in 1939.

Events for the 50th anniversary, from May 6th to 8th 1995, were equally elaborate. Months before, a 12-person working party laid out plans for a service by the bridge, the passing of a lighted torch, a procession to the Cross, a floodlit barbecue and a “design-a-mug competition”. Seven mug designs were entered, but all proved too expensive to produce, so a simpler look including the school logo was agreed instead.

A 49-minute video of those three days of gatherings was made and has been digitised by the Historical Society. Amid pubs decked out with flags, a throng of villagers are shown climbing the hill to outline the Cross with candles and to light a giant beacon, with Danny Kingshill at the head of a musical crocodile of children. Prayers and readings in the village are led by the Revd Barry Simmons, a Spitfire does aerobatics, guns are fired on the hill, and there’s an exhibition in the Village Hall where the mugs are handed out to slightly dubious-looking under-elevens. Profits from the events funded a party for veterans to mark VJ Day on 15th August. “Many stories were swapped and a good time was had by all,” noted the commentary on the video.

THE CHURCHYARD BUTTERFLY

Holly Blue can be thought of as a butterfly of churchyards as the larva (caterpillar) has two food plants, holly and ivy, both of which are common in churchyards. Holly Blues have two broods per year, the first eggs hatch in May and the larvae feed mainly on flower buds and leaves of holly. They then pupate and emerge as butterflies in late summer ready to lay eggs. This second batch of eggs then hatches in August and the caterpillars feed on ivy. Look for holes where they have munched through holly and ivy flower buds! These caterpillars form chrysalises and overwinter like that, they then hatch out in April and May when the butterfly can first be seen, ready to lay those first eggs in May. The adults have different eating habits from the caterpillars, feeding on flower nectar, oozing plant and tree sap, aphid honeydew and juice from rotting fruit and carrion. They take the trace elements and minerals that they need from bird and animal droppings.

Blue butterflies can be quite a difficult group to identify, but Holly Blues are much easier than other blues as they fly high around trees rather than staying close to the ground. They are a lovely pale silvery blue colour with a wingspan of about 3cm and can be seen between late March and mid-June and then again from late July through to September. The males are territorial, if you see a butterfly flying around the top of a holly or ivy-covered tree or wall, they may be driving off other males and attracting females to come and lay eggs, which they will fertilise.

A key conservation principle is that an animal has different needs at different times, all of which must be met if the population can survive and thrive. In the case of the Holly Blue, the adult needs somewhere to lay eggs, the caterpillars and then the adults both need food. A churchyard with holly and ivy growing, as well as wildflowers, insects such as aphids and plenty of other life providing both droppings and then carrion is ideal. Please look out for Holly Blues flying and also the holes made by hungry caterpillars!
