

because no matter whom you've lost, at this time of year it is a poignant reminder amidst the celebrations that the person isn't with you anymore.

And then, for all of us, of course, we continue to live with the uncertainty brought by Covid.

But Christmas holds other things too. Although, as the poem by Malcolm Hughes reminds us, we can sanitise and sentimentalise God or reduce God to some sort cliché or glib answer, focusing on the true meaning of Christmas can actually be a surprising source of comfort.

Christmas gives us an opportunity to ponder God becoming human in the birth of Jesus. For God's life-changing love, revealed in the birth of Jesus, is the heart of Christmas. That doesn't mean that those dark or difficult times, those 'valleys of the shadow of death', magically disappear but there is something about the God we encounter at Christmas, that we can relate to and brings us hope.

Somehow, in ways that we can't understand or explain, as we kneel at the manger, we find ourselves we find ourselves face to face with God:

"... a God who comes very close and makes himself at home; who stands on no ceremony and has no majesty about him except the majesty of love ... a God who seems so small, so vulnerable, and yet is large enough to hold the universe in his embrace." (Trevor Dennis from *The Christmas Stories*).

At Christmas we celebrate God in the manger. The light shining in the darkness. The light behind every shadow. That light that may only be like a tiny candle, flickering in the darkness but it is there. And, as we know, the darker the place, the more we notice (and the more we need), those glimpses of the light.

Whatever Christmas holds for us this year, God is with us. God whose love comes down at Christmas and whose heart beats for you. So, let us go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place.

My very best wishes for a hope filled Christmas, whatever it holds for you this year.

EMERGENCY RESILIENCE

It seems that we receive reports of extreme weather events in different parts of the world and even in this country each week. The Kent Resilience Forum are warning us to expect more of these each year. It is difficult to prepare for these but we do need to maintain our resilience to heavy rain and snow to avoid the risk of flooding and isolation. The one thing we can and must do is to ensure that our drains and river ways are unobstructed and keep flowing. We are very grateful to Lindsay and Duncan McRae for their expert managing of the weir and to the landowners who have tried to ensure that the River Darent and the Manor Drain keep flowing. We all can help:

- 1. Nothing, even vegetation, should be put in the river. Any blockages or debris should immediately be reported to the Environment Agency.
- 2. Drains should be kept clear. To ensure this it is important that leaves and debris are cleared regularly from the gullies. Whilst Sevenoaks District Council do send a sweeper van around regularly, it is impossible for the gullies to be completely cleared because of parked cars. If everyone took time to look at the gullies outside their properties and clear them, it would save drains becoming blocked. Kent County Council are aware of the blocked drains in Station Road. Anyone can report a blockage online by following the website; KCC Highways, Report a Fault and indicate on the map where the problem is.

Anyone who lives within the 100 year flood risk area should have their own Personal Flood Plan. This is basically a check list of everything that needs to be done before vacating a flooded property and essentials to be taken on vacating. There are also modifications that can be made to your property and items that can be purchased: smart airbricks or airbrick covers, non-return valves for waste water pipes, flood sacks and pan seals for ground floor toilets. We do have a Resilience Plan for the village as a whole.

I shall be attending the next Parish Council Meeting to report on updates and could bring samples of the items mentioned that were left for us by a company that came to present an information event some years ago. The village has coped with many emergency

This was a special year for Britain as it was the year that we changed from the Julian calendar to the Gregorian. It was not a simple process it required a degree of diplomatic skills and scientific certainty. Some countries in Europe adopted the new calendar in 1582 and Turkey was the last to do so in 1926. changing was that the Julian calendar had an inbuilt error, it was out by 1 day in every 128 years due to a miscalculation of the solar year by 11 minutes. This affected the date of Easter, traditionally observed on March 21st as it began to move further away from the spring equinox with each passing year.

For the majority of the British population the concept of any change was difficult to grasp, when they heard that to align Britain with most of Europe it meant, in essence, losing eleven days from 1751 so that 1752 started on the first of January, it triggered an irrational protest from a number of ill informed MP's. Of course no one would die eleven days early or that it was a portentous indication of an imminent Armageddon.

Clock winders had to take note and farmers might take off their caps and scratch their heads and wonder why their crops appeared to ripen a little earlier. A campaign was launched with the cry "GIVE US BACK OUR ELEVEN DAYS" perhaps not so different to the cries of climate change deniers of today.

The stone carver who chiselled 1752 above our door and the residents of Rose Cottage at that time were probably unaware of the significance of this date, we will never know, but I would like to think that down here in the peace of Magpie Bottom it really didn't matter. Happy Christmas to you all.

Agnes Hilton, known to everyone in the village as Ann, passed away peacefully aged 96, on 10th November having lived at The Bungalows in Church Street for over twenty five years before moving to Monmouth three years ago to be with her family and grandchildren

Whilst in the village, her door was always open for friends to pop in and she was friend and confidant to so many. Initially, she came to run the small grocery shop (now the Honeypot Tea Rooms) and absolutely loved the children of the village. Many of them today; with their own children will remember how they came into the shop and she would sell them even tiny quantities of sweets from the jars if that was all the money they had, or they wanted to spin out a small amount of pocket money over the week. She was involved in many village roles including wardrobe mistress for the Shoreham Players, President of the Sevenoaks Alpha Poetry Group, Secretary of Shoreham W.I. and Treasurer of the Over 60's as well as helping with the village prescription run until she stopped driving at the age of ninety two.

Born and raised in the small Scottish, coastal town of Ayr, she became politically active as a teenager whilst working in the post office. She and my father moved to London in 1952, when my two brothers were just infants and I was on the way, so that was quite a leap. With two thirds of Dad's salary going to pay for the mortgage, things were financially very tight and whilst he was out many evenings earning extra money giving talks and lectures. She was writing articles and stories for journals whilst bringing up a family of four that included my foster sister.

She supported Dad throughout his political career and when he became MP for Bethnal Green for ten years, she played a leading role in all constituency and parliamentary matters. She later used those experiences to play a valuable role in the Citizens Advice Bureau. Always interested in people she had many friends of all ages. We miss her sorely and give thanks to all her friends in the village that helped to make her so happy here.
