CORONATION CELEBRATIONS IN SHOREHAM ... 1902 TO 2023

Edward, Prince of Wales, became King Edward VII and in August 1902 there was a coronation day service in the church, an early morning peal of bells and village festivities including a bonfire and fireworks. Nearly all the houses in Shoreham were decorated with flags. Some residents no doubt recalled seeing their new king in person when he used to come to Shoreham Place for a shooting party.

The coronation day of King George V and Queen Mary in 1911 was marked with two services in church, a peal of bells and a public tea. Arrangements had been made for inside venues, which was fortunate as it was showery. There were sporting competitions, music provided by the Shoreham band, fireworks display and a huge bonfire.


The coronation day of King George VI in 1937 was a joyful occasion, marked with a church service and a comprehensive sports programme on the sports field. There was maypole dancing, teas, a cricket match, a carnival dance, a whist drive and village houses were suitably decorated. Sadly, the weather was wet that day.

For the late Queen's coronation of 1953 special forms of service which had been produced for churches were used for the main morning and the evening service on the Sunday before the big day. (Extracts taken from the yet to be published, book *Vicars of Shoreham 1889 - present day* by Alain Cozens)

The Coronation service is rooted in longstanding tradition and Christian symbolism.

In the New Testament, Jesus is described as a king. Even Pilate, who signs Jesus 'death warrant, writes on it "the King of the Jews". But his model of kingship was very different. It was not about power or prestige, wealth or status. Most people who came across him in the 1st Century would not have thought he was a king of any kind. Jesus' sentence to death by crucifixion being usually used for criminals.

However, the consistent witness of those who were there and wrote about these things is that Jesus rose from death after three days, and that one day he will return to this world. At that point, Christians believe that heaven and earth

will be renewed and reconciled, and Jesus will reign, the King of justice and of peace.

Much of this lies behind the symbolism of the coronation. For example, the ring King Charles III will receive is marked with a cross, a reminder of the ultimate king in whose footsteps he follows. The rod he will receive is topped with a dove, the symbol of the Holy Spirit, whose wisdom he will need to rule well. The orb, a representation of the earth, is crowned with a cross as a reminder that Jesus is the ultimate king of the world. And the oil with which he will be anointed is another symbol of the Holy Spirit, a prayer that God will anoint and equip the King to serve this nation.

Whatever we think about the system of monarchy, the Coronation will be a historic moment in the life of our nation; a time to reflect on our history, explore some of the wider themes, including service to others, celebrate who we are and look to our future. *Rev Diane*

Let's hope that May will bring better weather as there is much going on! The Shoreham Society is supporting Henry Desmond's Big Coronation Lunch and Party on Sunday 7^{th} May – 12 noon onwards. A great opportunity for the whole Village to get together and have some fun.

And then, on Sunday 14th May, it is the Duck Race!

Most of you will have been many times before, but it is worth repeating some of the details, with a few added reminders. The Duck Race was originally started to promote the protection of the river and now, all these years later, this is even more urgent. So, recycling is a theme and home-made ducks will always win the style awards. Plastic ducks are difficult to avoid but, **please**, *no very small ducks* as they cannot be caught at the end of the race. Registration is from 1.30 and the Race starts at 2.30. You should collect all ducks from the bottom of Mill Lane by 4pm. The cost to enter, if you have your own duck, is $\pounds 2$. If you wish to purchase an orphan duck, some will be available at $\pounds 2$, with a further $\pounds 2$ for entry to the race.

Once again, Simon Greenwood has agreed to open the Heavy Horse Show Field for parking – if it's not too wet. Proceeds will be going to the Darent River Preservation Society (DRiPS), to the School and for the benefit of the village. Trains will only be running between Swanley and Sevenoaks on the day, but please encourage your visitors to use the train if they can.

Be there to enjoy the excitement of the grand arrival of the Duckmaster in his Duckmobile, the judging of the style awards and, finally, the big countdown before the ducks are free to race down the River.

Our next event will be a guided farm walk around Castle Farm, but this is for members only. Do join the Shoreham Society if you are interested - it will be well worth your subscription. Did you know that there was a Shoreham Castle? But the Farm was built on top of it!

Equally fascinating will be the Grassland and Orchid Walk around Magpie Bottom on Saturday 10th June, 10am, led by Mark Gallant. This is open to all - details to follow.

You may have seen the new flower bed at Shoreham Station. This is provided by 'station adopters' from the Darent Valley Community Rail Partnership, and if you have any spare plants from your garden, they would be most welcome.

Finally, one request – you'll have appreciated the Church Field path to the station, which the owner has very kindly allowed as a permissive path. Please remember that walking your dog anywhere else on or around the field is not allowed.

When we visit a churchyard today, what comes to mind? If we see only a group of headstones, then we are missing much that these special places can tell us. Although now quiet and peaceful, they used to be bustling with community events where both religious and non-religious activities took place.

King James the First decreed in 1619 that 'traditional churchyard games' were to be encouraged providing they were held 'in due and convenient time, and without implement or let of Divine Service.' People frequently played games like quoits and ninepins. The church and chapel walls were used to play a game called fives. Even wrestling and cockfighting took place in the north side of the churchyard! (The south side was dedicated to more sacred activities).

There are records of Saxon Moots or parliaments being held in churchyards. Crowds would gather to watch miracle plays and sacred dramas and local markets selling food and crafts were frequently held there.

Beer festivals known as 'church ales' took place and were feasts of eating, drinking and merrymaking. They were organised by churchwardens to raise funds. Archaeological digs have found the footings of structures used for these varied activities.

Many churchyards also have their own unique tales and folklore that add to their charm and intrigue. These stories are yet another fascinating aspect of the riches found in these ancient spaces. Andrea Gilpin <u>andrea@cfga.org.uk</u> <u>www.caringforgodsacre.org.uk</u>

TALES FROM THE HILL

I was brought up in the Catholic Church, well not exactly but nearly, for a large room in my childhood home that once housed a billiard table and then used as Home Guard HQ, had a further use as a Catholic Mass centre, this last function lasted from 1949 till 1960. Every Sunday I and my four siblings would have to carry the chairs from the house for the use of around 40 members of the congregation .As a child I thought 40 people taking over the house singing hymns and responses and visiting priests donning coloured vestments as quite normal.

I was aware though, of tensions between my mum and dad over the expectations of the visiting clergy, who got used to a full English breakfast after mass. Their expectations sometimes ran over into a Sunday roast. On top of feeding 5 kids my mum found it all too much and the schism between my mum and the Catholic Church grew. Eventually she declared that her house was not "a blooming cafe." It was not helped when, on occasions my dad was tempted to open the whisky.

Before mass began the priest would hear confessions in our sitting room, perhaps the most bizarre part of our Sunday mornings.

There was one occasion when my elder brother dared me to hide behind the sofa and eavesdrop on the confessions, My brother was disappointed as I was too petrified to hear or understand what was being confessed.

Back in the 1950's communism was the churches greatest fear so before mass started the celebrant would ask the congregation to kneel and pray for the conversion of Russia, this puzzled me for some time for what did Russia have to do with rugby? In a way I suppose these prayers worked only to be replaced by something worse. As so often is the case it is the vacuum that is left behind after conflict that has the cruellest and long lasting effect on a population. *John Bovington*
