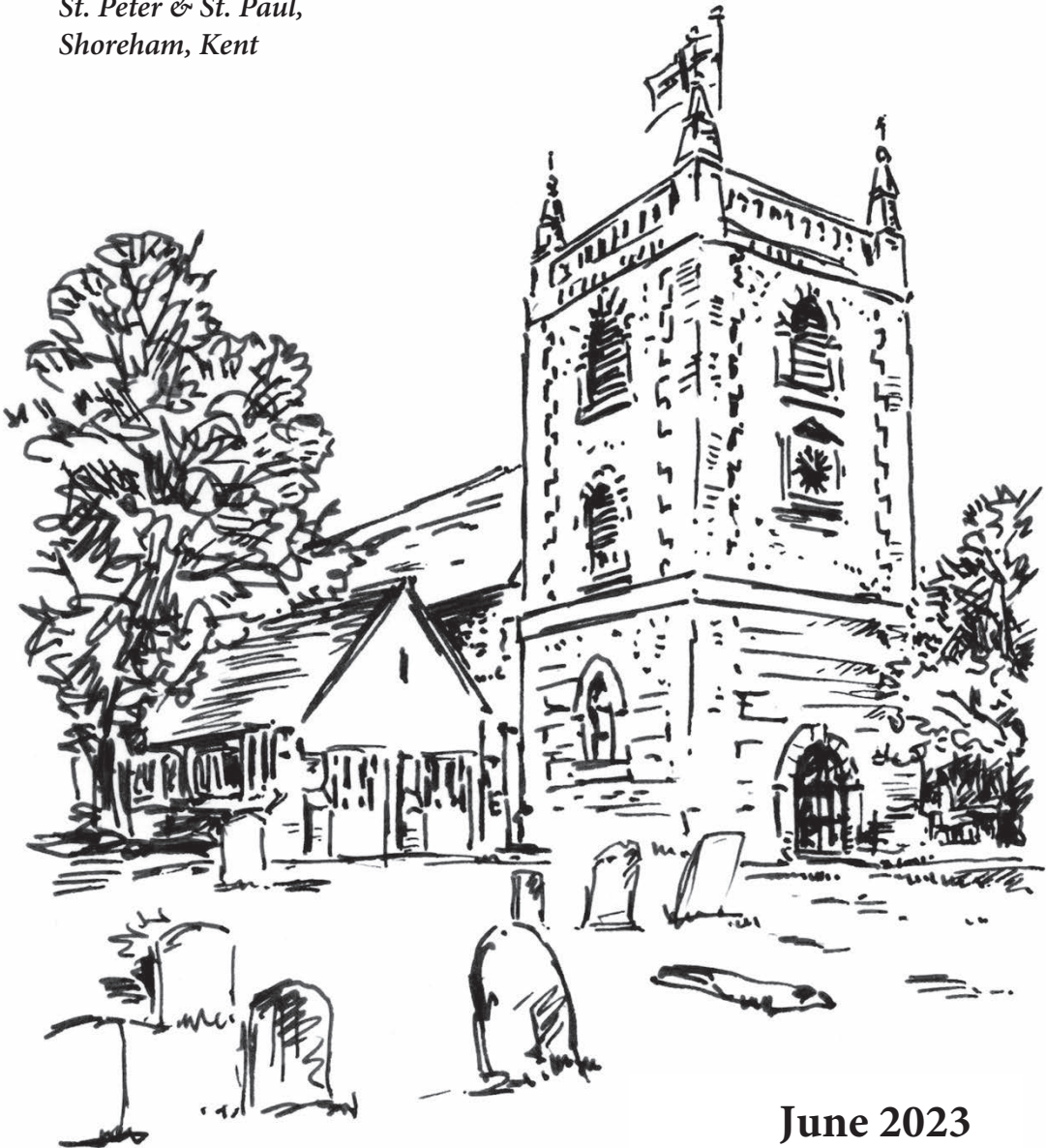

SAINT PETER AND SAINT PAUL - OUR PATRON SAINTS

The special day of celebration, when we remember the two saints our church is dedicated to is called a Patronal Festival. We celebrate this on the closest convenient Sunday to 29th June (see below). What we know about our two saints, would fill many, many years of Gazette articles ... so, in solidarity with those who are in the middle of writing school reports ... here are two brief ones:

PETER

General comments: Peter can best be described as a kind of Tigger character. He is full of energy, impetuous and sometimes boastful. Peter loves being in the spotlight and is always the first to answer Jesus' questions. He tends to act first, before his brain is fully engaged. Often though, this is with good intentions, such as protecting Jesus, as soldiers come to arrest him, or rushing into the empty tomb with no fear of what he might find. His impulsiveness can mean he is prepared to take risks and step out in faith, such as when Jesus invites him to walk on water. Peter sometimes surprises with profound insights. Peter is devoted to Jesus and was devastated when, after Jesus' arrest, he betrayed him. They have since reconciled.

Summary: Extrovert, generous, warm and loyal. The one, whose name means, 'the rock', to whom Jesus entrusts the building of the church.

Attendance: Has been excellent right from the beginning, when Peter was introduced to Jesus by his brother Andrew, another fisherman.

PAUL

General comments: Paul is an 'all or nothing' kind of person. Following a dramatic conversion experience, Paul has been a courageous, visionary, uncompromising disciple of Jesus. He is prepared to risk imprisonment, even death, as he shares his faith. Paul can speak, with integrity, in a variety of contexts, in a thought-provoking way. In his written communication, Paul is realistic and sensitive to the needs of others.

Summary: Gifted and inspirational leader who completely turns his life around, from persecutor of Christians to follower of Christ. He gives us these 5 characteristics of love: Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs.

Attendance: Non-existent at the start, which was probably a relief all round, as in earlier days, Paul, or Saul, as he was then, actively persecuted Christians.

As well as there being plenty to say about each of them, I also love the fact that they are real human beings, with their faults and failings, as well as their passions and skills. They are ordinary people and yet with God, their lives became extraordinary too

ST PETER AND ST PAUL'S "STAY AND PLAY" IS CELEBRATING ITS FIRST BIRTHDAY.

On the 12th June 2023 "Stay and Play" run by the church in Shoreham, will be celebrating its first birthday. In our first year we have welcomed almost 100 families, counting in about 26 children every week and with our special events (summer picnic and Easter egg hunt) attracting almost 40 children with their parents and carers.

Each week, imaginative craft and hands on exploratory activities run alongside a beautiful selection of toys and games, many of which belonged to the pre-Covid playgroup that was run successfully by a group of mums and many of which have subsequently been donated to or bought by the church. With Liz as a qualified Early Years playleader, the preparation for each session is second to none. Whether it be the thematically linked snacks (think pancakes, hot cross buns, and animal shaped biscuits) or the creative craft activities, making whales with googly eyes for the Jonah story, or donkeys with pegs for legs for Palm Sunday, there has been plenty of variety each week. Of course some children have favourites; the little car to sit in, the book corner, the garages, the dressing up, the slides, the jigsaws...I could go on. Also pleasing is to see the friendships developing between carers, mums and dads. In the themes we follow, we mark the key points of the Christian year and other civic and national moments. A massive shout out to all the church helpers who come each week to welcome people in and serve refreshments and big congratulations to Liz for making it all happen.

SHOREHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Following the local elections on 4 May 2023 Cllrs Jonathan Histed, Brian Jeffery and Neil Powell were re-elected and Cllr Gavin Owen was elected to the Parish Council.

The Parish Council has 8 Members, Shoreham ward (6), Well Hill ward (1) and East Hill (1). After the elections there were 4 vacancies, 3 in the Shoreham ward and 1 in the Well Hill ward. Under current legislation the Parish Council was able to co-opt 4 further Members within 35 days of the election.

The first meeting of the Parish Council and Annual General Meeting took place on Wednesday 17 May 2023 and Cllr Jonathan Histed was elected as Chairman and Cllr Brian Jeffery as Vice Chairman. Members also unanimously agreed to co-opt on to the Parish Council, Roy Blamey, Alice Montgomerie, Martin Sheward and John Thorpe. The Council warmly welcomes all the new Members.

The new Council will be meeting again in June to look at the issues in the Parish and agree the priorities for this Council.

Please find below an update on the following items which were carried over from the previous Council.

A225 Shoreham Road – the proposal was approved by the Joint Transport Board on 13 December 2022 and the Council have instructed KCC to go ahead with the design of the new road conditions. Cllrs Jeffery, Powell and Roy (District Councillor) are meeting with KCC Highways to try and move this project forward.

NEWS FROM SHOREHAM VILLAGE SCHOOL, MAY 2023

We had a joyful Friday to celebrate the King's Coronation, with each class providing food for our feast. All classes were given a budget of £25 and tasked to produce food for every child in school. Barton Class made nutritious fruit skewers, Palmer Class made a range of sandwiches, filled bagels and wraps, Moore Class made some beautifully decorated cupcakes and Cameron Class made pizzas (making their own dough from flour and yoghurt). This party planning gave each class the opportunity to flex their maths, DT, creative and written muscles as they applied what they learn in school to a real-world problem. The skills used were clearly advanced as we managed to ensure that not a scrap of food was left behind (although I think a few children may have indulged in some seconds and maybe even thirds of some of the courses!) In assembly, Glee Club sang our coronation song, 'Sing for the King' with great enthusiasm and wore their crowns with pride.

Did you know that Shoreham Village is in the aspiring **Cross-Channel UNESCO Global Geopark**? We were visited by Louella from Kent Downs who led an assembly about the Geopark. It was fantastic to have an 'expert' using geological terminology and expanding the pupils' knowledge and interest in our local (and wider) area. She told us that the English and French coasts are still connected by the chalk layer that we can see in Dover and that it runs all the way to London.

A Year 3 and 4 team of 8 children, took part in a Mini-Red Tennis Tournament at Hollybush, Tennis Academy. They played some amazing matches, winning some and losing some. It was clear to the spectators how much their skills and understanding of the game developed whilst they were playing.

The Pupil Leadership Team carried out an audit of the current equipment available to play with at break and lunchtimes and conducted surveys with each class. They then presented their findings to me and recommended the play equipment that would be most enjoyed by our pupils. I have honoured their work, as much as possible, and the playground / field now boasts a wonderful range of items, including: scooters (with helmets), swing ball, limbo, tunnels, dolls, skipping ropes, balls, target ball-shoot, and parachutes. It is a joy to go out on the playground and see the children having such fun,

Train news: Train travel hasn't been easy with the strikes, but there are bargains to be had for summer outings. The "Kids for a Quid" offer means that a child ticket bought alongside an adult ticket is charged at only £1. "Groupsave" is a deal whereby 3 or more adults travelling together get a third off all adult fares for off peak travel without the need for a railcard. The ticket machine or Southeastern's online booking system should calculate these fares automatically. They only work in the Southeastern area.

TALES FROM THE HILL

I recently received an email from Julie Clulow, an artist who used to live and teach in North Kent. The reason for her communication was that she had read the piece I wrote about the artist Vincent New who painted in and around Shoreham. Vincent in his sketchbook of Otford & Shoreham mentions that Palmer used to get his sketching paper from Shoreham paper mill, and she wanted to know if I could throw more light on the subject, unfortunately I could not.

Julie has carried out considerable research on Palmer which included meeting with Palmer's great grandson Allan Palmer in Vancouver. Books and biographies about Palmer now abound but Julie provided me with some facts that I have not heard before.

Samuel Palmer learnt about the village's connection with smuggling from one of his tenants, John Penn. Sadly he and his wife were paupers and lived in one of the old cottages which once stood on the southern side of Church Street. Palmer owned the plot of land immediately next to the school which extended almost as far as The King's Arms. Somewhere on that plot is also where the ancient cottage Balsatt stood; rather than being on the northern side at Reedbeds, as is generally supposed.

Palmer was made aware of the smuggling activities in and around the village by John Penn, who was most likely one of the local lookouts for the infamous Hawkhurst gang. By the time Palmer knew Penn he must have been aware of Penn's claim to fame as the man who loved rat pudding, much to his wife's disgust. Penn met his end by choking on

a bolus of cobbler's wax! By the 1841 census both Penn and his wife had died, leaving one daughter. I believe they are buried in St Peter & St Paul's churchyard.

Cobblers Wax -A combination of pine resin, beeswax and pitch used to soften thread in the manufacture of bagpipes, tying fishing flies and mending boots. So how did John come to choke on it? I don't think he was making bagpipes, Was he preparing to go fishing, or more likely mending his boots, maybe he was chewing this concoction to soften it up! Who knows?
